What is Accelerated Reader?

Accelerated Reader (AR) is a computer programme that motivates children to read, and helps teachers manage and monitor a child's independent reading practice. Children pick a book that falls within their ZPD (book band) level and, when they have finished reading it, take a short quiz on the computer; passing the quiz is an indication that the child has understood what they have read. If they are reading at the recommended level for them, then most children are likely to be successful and enjoy the books and quizzes. Best of all they learn and grow at their own pace.

What are points? What awards can be achieved?

Each book that has an AR reading practice quiz is given a point value. These points are based on the difficulty and length of the book. For example, J. K. Rowling's 'Harry Potter and the Goblet of Fire' is worth 32 points, while Roald Dahl's 'Fantastic Mr. Fox' is worth 1 point. Students will earn points depending on how well they do on the quiz. A score of 80% or more is needed to pass a quiz. Children should aim to take a quiz within 2 days of finishing a book. Where possible, children should take quizzes at home. However, there will time in school for children to access quizzes as required. When children reach certain reading milestones, they will receive a certificate, including for becoming a word 'millionaire'.

Which books have an AR quiz?

There are over 20,000 books, both fiction and non-fiction, with an AR quiz, and many of these are available in classroom book corners. Students are also encouraged to read books they may have at home or have borrowed from the local library. To find out if a book has a quiz, you can visit the AR Bookfinder site at:

What ZPD level is my child and how often does it change?

Children take a STAR Reading assessment in school every half-term to track their reading growth. After every assessment, your child's new ZPD level will be stuck into their reading record. The AR Bookfinder website is a great place to find books at your child's current ZPD level. <u>Your child's Accelerated Reader login details can be found stuck into their reading record</u>.

What do book quizzes look like?


AR book quizzes are multiple choice and test children's understanding of what they have read. Here is an example of a question from an AR quiz:



How does my child log in to Accelerated Reader?
